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SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Senator Raikes, refresh my memory again. The money that we have set aside in the School District Reorganization Fund, that was for two years?

SENATOR RAIKES: Two years, at \$1 million per year, up to \$1 million per year.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Okay. And that was set for years, what?

SENATOR RAIKES: 2005-06 and 2006-07.

SENATOR HUDKINS: So what you're doing in your amendment is just restating that second year?

SENATOR RAIKES: Right, that's correct.

SENATOR HUDKINS: The money that is being reserved, the \$1 million...well, let me back up. Was the first \$1 million in the last year's fiscal year, was that used for school district reorganization?

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm not sure it was all used, but I could find that out for you.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Okay. And so this year, how do you envision this \$1 million being used?

SENATOR RAIKES: It supports...it would support the same program. And I'm going to guess a little bit here, but roughly speaking, the organization...the reorganization incentive, the amount of the payment to a school district, was based somewhat on the size of the school district before the reorganization and the size after reorganization. So, you know, it was kind of an economies of size argument.

SENATOR HUDKINS: So who actually gets the monies, then--the larger school or...?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, the reorganized district would get the ...
