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SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...is exactly where that...where that is at. Now, whenever they're doing that then they can go to Creighton or they can go to any school and then go out into a public school. So actually, you would be giving funding for either parochial schools or something like that, but it would...

SENATOR THOMPSON: It goes to the student.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Right.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Right.

SENATOR LOUDEN: But the student has already paid for it, not depending if you're going to match it with what their tuition was. Then it is a loan forgiveness fund,...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Correct.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...is what you're working on.

SENATOR THOMPSON: You bet.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah. Now do you...is there any way that you can put a dollar amount on that rather than have it open-ended? Because out in the future there it gets to be some big bucks that's going out of this.

SENATOR THOMPSON: The amendment is \$250,000, \$500,000, and it tops at \$1 million, so it is specific.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah, but then it's a million every year.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Right.

SENATOR LOUDEN: But why not...why not leave it \$250,000 every year? Can you answer (inaudible)?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Well, because the theory being...
