wanted to use that word instead of repeating two or three times the phraseology, "a person under the age of 18." So "minor" simply shortens and makes more precise what it is that's being said. In line 16 on page 2, "sexually explicit performance" is defined, and it means a live or public play, dance, show or other exhibition intended to arouse or gratify sexual desire or to appeal to prurient interests. That definition is needed, because it might be one of the activities that one of these persons who is victimized would be required to perform. Then the definition of "trafficking victim" means a person subjected to any act or acts prohibited by this legislation. As you go through the rest of the bill, you will see that there are certain penalties established for violations. Some of the penalties in the original offering were unduly harsh, and in one instance the punishment for violating a portion of this bill was more severe than the punishment that exists currently for forcible rape. So there was an attempt to correlate the punishments in this bill for violations of particular sections and subsections, with the existing punishments for similar types of misconduct. If you have any questions about the bill, or curiosity, or just interest, you can put such question or questions to me, and I will be pleased to answer them. And having said those things, I'm offering the amendment on behalf of myself, Senator Stuhr, any of the persons who might wind up being victims, the friends, the families, those concerned about victims. It's being offered for your consideration. I hope for your acceptance. Thank you, Mr. President.
