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just felt that there should be some follow-up and some account, you know, some accountability.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I just wondered, so it doesn't languish...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, and I think...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...somewhere and say, well, I didn't know who was...

SENATOR STUHR: ...the floor debate is good, so that there is something on the record, that there is someone designated to do that report.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, the reason, as I've been here over the years, I don't know whether anybody would send a report to Health and Human Services. I don't know whether it's a state...I don't know if the State Patrol would collect this information. I just wonder if we ought to think about who really is going to get that information. You have it here who's going to compile it...

SENATOR STUHR: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...but there apparently is no place for this information to be centralized and I just...something to think about as I read that last page.

SENATOR STUHR: Well, I would hope that, you know, both departments would be more alert, you know, to the issue now, and then follow up, you know. That is the point of including it in the legislation.

SENATOR BOURNE: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Well, thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Stuthman, you're recognized.
