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which shall only be used for such purpose, so there is no capital expenditure here for any capital projects. And I'll give the balance of my time to Senator Fischer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Fischer, about 4, 30.

SENATOR FISCHER: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Synowiecki, could I ask you some questions, then, on this?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Synowiecki, would you yield?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Are you asking that I dominate this time period, too?

SENATOR FISCHER: No, I'm asking...

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Okay.

SENATOR FISCHER: ...I'm asking that you give me some short answers this time.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you.

SENATOR FISCHER: Okay. Under this program that we're asking, you know, for \$750,000, how many women do you think will be served?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: In my discussions with the WELLSRING program, the Salvation Army program...and you know, the short answer is I don't know exactly yet. We'll have to see what the response is from, first, the regional behavioral health authorities relative to their applying for the monies under this bill, and then secondly, we'll need to see the type of programs that evolve as a result of this. For example, in my community I've been working with the probation department, the city prosecutor's office, WELLSRING, and we're getting a collaborative effort along with the community groups, neighborhood associations, getting a collaborative effort together, so that when these, hopefully, when these monies come into the pipeline, we'll be ready to have a competitive application to draw down some of this funding so we can have a
