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into this, we're on a path. We're on a path toward expanding a program to add more providers with more resources. Senator Pederson is saying now, with his amendment, let's peel that off. Naturally, I'm going to vote no. You know that. And you go where you need to go on this. This is a reimbursement program. There are probably hundreds and hundreds of providers out there who can do the key services identified in this program, which is Pap smears, chlamydia tests, and the prescription of antibiotics. Hundreds can do that. Physicians' assistants, not only doctors and healthcare clinics, but physicians' assistants can do this. Nurse practitioners can do this kind of thing. We can have many, many providers, and we've got the resources to do it. This amendment takes us back in a different direction. I can't let this issue go without saying a word about Planned Parenthood, because that is such a big factor here, because Planned Parenthood really is different. They're different from the OneWorld Community Health Center. They're different from Charles Drew Health Center. They're different from the Douglas County Health Department or the Lincoln-Lancaster Health Department, or the People's Health Network on North 27th Street. They're very, very different. What makes them different, of course, is that they perform abortions. They do it in my district, and I'm offended by it. And my offense at that is only compounded by the knowledge that Planned Parenthood is receiving large sums of money, both from the federal government and from our own Nebraska state government. I think that's wrong. I think that's very wrong, and I've never tried to hide my feelings on that. I took my views directly to the Appropriations Committee a year ago after studying this matter, with a lot of research that I did and others, where I showed them the spreadsheet of \$1.2 million of federal and state funds that flowed through our accounting system to Planned Parenthood over a particular time frame that I was looking at, roughly a year and a half time frame, \$1.2 million. In this particular program alone, just this one little program, Planned Parenthood is one-third of the take. They're one-third of this program. They have an exclusive contract for Lancaster County and surrounding regions. Why? Why do they have that? Are there no other healthcare providers in Lancaster County who could do this? Of course there are, dozens and dozens and dozens of them. I also took my concerns to the Health Committee this
