So when I hear all the noise and the confusion, then that's the signal for me to get rid of everything. Then when they say, oh, you know, Ms. Thompson, we're so sorry we came to your house, but the address was the house next-door, that's where the miscreants are, so we'll go over there. So they come over to my house. I'm an upstanding citizen. I know them and they know me, and I give them money to buy more than doughnuts. So I say, officer, come on in. You don't need a warrant. I'm a law-abiding citizen. I've got nothing to hide. Come on in. And they don't find anything. But they messed over Ms. Thompson. Then they don't even want to issue an apology. That's the kind of stuff that happens in my community. And I'm supposed to believe that these so-called drug task force are of any value? And the U.S. Attorney is involved, and the FBI Alcohol, Tobacco, Explosives, Firearms Agency, and a lot of times I mix up their letters on purpose, because they get angry when you don't give the proper sequence of their names or their letters. Where are they? Sitting around doing nothing and telling these white senators, oh, we're doing such a great job; we arrested 400 drug dealers out in the area of, wherever Senator Adrian Smith lives, Scotts Bluff, 400 drug dealers; giving these bogus statistics. And senators buy it, lobbyists for these cities and these sheriffs' departments buy it. And the sheriff...the sheriffs know that they're lying. The police know that they're lying. And if they say they don't know who's selling guns, they don't know what these kids know. You ought to take the chief and sit him down and take one of these teenagers and make him chief of police in Omaha, and he can tell you where the drug dealers are, he can tell you the ones selling the guns, and he can probably point out the cops who are complicit also. And where do we have to go for redress? Not the floor of this Legislature. I have people here saying, give these wrongdoers more money. To do what with? Buy doughnuts? They ain't going to get this money, not today.
