treatment. I don't want to talk about families affected by I want to talk about catching folks that are distributing drugs. Whether they're using or not, I want them caught, and that's exactly what this program does. We're losing federal funding. I've heard that, you know, we lose federal funding all the time, and it's a...you know, state can't pick up all this revenue. I'll tell you what, we do it all the time. Look at Medicaid. They give up on us on Medicaid all the time, over and over, and we pick up the tab. The federal government giveth, and they taketh away, just like state government does. This time, if you think it's important to pick people up for dealing drugs, it's \$460,000 one time. I'm not going to pick on...well, I am. I'm going to pick on Senator Stuhr's LB 690 that we didn't get to today. That's \$450,000 a year for two years, or three years, or four years. And with due respect to the program, it has platitudes in how we're going to help folks in education. Here, let me just read you some of the things. We're going to collaborate. We're going to create models of collaboration between career and academic education. I mean, and I'm not belittling what she's doing. I'm simply saying, we're ready to spend \$900,000 on programs that have no outcome, no deliverable, merely platitudes, and we're willing to spend that money tomorrow. And I'm saying that we need \$460,000 today for a program that in my opinion works, that in the opinion of most law enforcement departments works, for one year, for one year. I don't say we rotate this through again. Let's work it out next year and figure out...law enforcement can help us figure out a solution. I'm simply saying that for \$460,000 we can keep a successful program working. In total, \$460,000, my God, we're...look at the budget. Look at our budget, look at the increase in spending we're doing in total; \$460,000 is lunch for the state, lunch for the folks that work over at the employees building. Four hundred and sixty thousand dollars is important to this program, to all parts of the state. Don't be confused by wrapping all of law enforcement into this program. Local cops, highway patrol, FBI, that's not part of this program. This is about dedicated organizations that go out in the field, as I heard earlier from Senator Flood, they're in the ditch, and their job is to pick up folks that are dealing drugs. the heck is wrong with that? Four hundred and sixty thousand dollars one year. Senator Pederson has a plan.
