SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. President, colleagues. reviewed this bill, and let me apologize to Senator Stuhr. Earlier discussion, I picked on this bill maybe a little heavy-handedly and I apologize for that. It's a laudable bill and I know that it means a lot, not only to Senator Stuhr but to the education of all our kids. And FA623 simply puts a sunset provision on the bill rather than continue a program that I believe needs some jelling and some time to come together because there are no defined or clearly defined outcome. There isn't an outcome. The accountability, I think, will come but it will take a bit of time. But as we frequently do in this body, we determine that it should come back to us at a point in time so that we can either reauthorize the program or not. offer for your approval the amendment that would allow this to sunset and come back to the body in five years. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Mines. Senator Stuhr, recognized to speak.
