SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...because obviously we haven't with campaign finance limitation, nor that people who operate within the system legitimately somehow are doing something wrong just by virtue of taking campaign contributions. And this is in no way supporting any of the individuals who have knowingly done things to circumvent the fairness of an election. But I also think that we have to be very, very careful that what we might label as money from a bad cause, somebody else might think is just fine. And that is where we get into freedom of speech issues. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. Further discussion? Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. (Laugh) Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in my community, we call this WFM--white folks' mess. That's all that this is. People's feelings have been hurt.
