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SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Yes. I'm going to be very brief, but I just have two quick points. One of them...in the presentation that we got from the federal people, and also the state Health and Human Services people were there, it was my understanding, when one of the persons from HHS was questioned, they thought they were going to be able to implement this without any new employees. Do you remember that conversation?

SENATOR HOWARD: I certainly remember the presentation. I don't remember the conversation regarding not needing additional employees.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, that's as I remember the conversation that day. And the other issue, as I was listening to you and Senator Stuthman, the exchange, he asked you something about if this had ever been heard on the floor, this particular issue. And didn't you...my memory says we did this already on General File on the first round of debate, this very same issue.

SENATOR HOWARD: You know, you are correct. You are correct, and I apologize for that. You are correct.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: So we did go through this, and we voted it down once on General File.

SENATOR HOWARD: We discussed it on General File, and I believe you're right.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. I would give some time to Senator Jensen, if he wants any. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, thank you. You know, I do have a little concern, in that we do have till next October in order to meet these, this criteria, and I don't want to ever get into the point where we're micromanaging a department. Certainly we can hold their feet to the fire, we can do a lot of other things, but to tell how many employees that they need, quite often we're told by them, by advancing a bill, how many more new FTEs they
