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SENATOR KREMER: Yes, I will.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kremer, if I understood you correctly, you said that this amendment is the substance of a bill that had gone to the Revenue Committee. Is that correct?

SENATOR KREMER: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did the Revenue Committee advance the bill?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, they did. I think the vote was 6 to 2 or something like that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why was not this amendment offered to a Revenue Committee bill?

SENATOR KREMER: It was an opportunity to put on this bill because it all dealt with the State Fair. And we was asked to do it, so we were willing to try it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was this amendment presented to the Ag Committee?

SENATOR KREMER: You mean was the bill...what do you mean by (inaudible)?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was the amendment? Was the amendment brought to the committee and the request made to attach it to this bill?

SENATOR KREMER: It was probably a verbal request that we would, so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it is a part of the Ag Committee's committee amendment.

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kremer, how did you vote on that proposed constitutional amendment to give the State Fair, was it 10 percent of the lottery take each year? How did you vote? Did you vote for that amendment?
