SENATOR KREMER: You know, I don't remember. I might have, with some hesitation, because I think it was on the constitution, which I'm not very excited about doing. But I felt like that it was a worthy cause.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you have any idea how much that amendment has produced for the State Fair?

SENATOR KREMER: From the lottery funds, or the checkoff?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: From the State Fair...from the constitutional amendment.

SENATOR KREMER: To the lottery? I think, what, \$2 million?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'm going to ask if...thank you, Senator Kremer. I'd like to ask Senator Janssen a question, if he knows the answer.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Janssen, would you respond, please?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'll certainly try, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, do you think that Senator Connealy may know the answer to this question if you don't, which is, how much money has that constitutional amendment generated from lottery funds which went to the State Fair?

SENATOR JANSSEN: If my recollection is right, I think around \$3 million; \$1 million, \$3 million, somewhere in there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Or two...let's say \$2 million; \$1 million to \$3 million would be \$2 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you're not sure?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Actually, no, I'm not positive.
