SENATOR CHAMBERS:    When you had an unfortunate accident, did I take the time to write what you felt was a nice rhyme about that, showing my sympathy for you?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    You did. My mother appreciated it also.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Thank you. Now, Senator Cudaback, how much jeopardy are you willing to put Senator Schimek's bill into in order to hold this provision?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    I think you know me, Senator Chambers. I won't take your time, but, you know, I feel strongly about this, and you feel strongly one way. So I guess maybe we don't meet eyes on this issue, although every other issue we seem to meet eyes about 90 percent of the time. So you can't agree on everything, I guess.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    So are you going to support my amendment to strike this from Senator Schimek's bill, so that her bill can move forward?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    I'd like to, but you know I can't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    So you're not going to support striking it?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    I...no, I won't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    So if it means Senator Schimek's bill goes down,...

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:    Did you talk to Senator Schimek about putting this on her bill?

SENATOR BAKER:      One minute.

SENATOR CUDABACK:    It is in the committee amendment, Senator Chambers, so.
