SENATOR CUDABACK: I won't take your time, because I know it's your time. But when I get to my time, maybe I can explain some of why I thought we should do this.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I know why you thought you should do it, because you made that clear. The thing I'm talking about doing is your leaving that amendment there when it jeopardizes Senator Schimek's bill. It's not the Ag Committee's bill, it's not your bill; it's Senator Schimek's bill.

SENATOR BAKER: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I'm going to listen to what you say...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and chart my course. But my course right now is, if this amendment stays,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Appreciate it. Appreciate it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...this bill is not going to move today.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Um-hum. Gotcha.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to speak.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I'm disappointed, because I wanted to support this amendment, and I guess other players beside myself will decide whether we...it goes on Senator Schimek's amendment. I understand Senator Chambers' position and the fact that it is up to persons offering the amendments, whoever they may be, to decide...to help decide where the main bill goes. I am puzzled, however, that I guess...since it's a voluntary check for those that want to support the State Fair, an institution that's been
