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or whatever. We took that out. We do not give the State Fair one dime. Yet, in my opinion, and you know how strongly I feel about the State Fair, that it's a place to go for everybody. So I just thought, if the people want to give a dollar, if...and I know Senator Chambers is not listening to me, and that's fine. But if the people want to give one dollar or two dollars, I just can't see why that is wrong, for the people to have a checkoff to give one dollar or two dollars. It's not from anybody's pocket, strictly voluntary. I guess that's my reason why I brought the bill and wanted to extend it. We've already implemented...I think most of the dollars went to set up the...whatever it is they had to do to set it up; \$51,000 of it went to set up. Now, we'll essentially be throwing those dollars away, in my opinion, throwing those dollars away, if we don't use the 51...what was it, \$51,000 from \$60,000 is about \$9,000 actually went to the State Fair. And in two years, if you don't like it, I guess...that's just my feeling, that in two years, if you didn't like this, then when the actual money went to the fair after the initial set-up costs, then so be it, but about \$20,000 or \$30,000 a year checkoff. And this...to me, it's just that simple. Now obviously, it's not that simple to Senator Chambers. And he has every right to not like this, every right not to like it, and I respect those rights of anybody in here absolutely if you don't like it. And he has a right to challenge this, just like any other bill, and I respect that part. But I just...we thought it should have a fair chance to be extended for two or three years, to see if it really worked, people wanted to do it. Senator Chambers, if you'd like some of my...I think people know what I'm going to say. If you'd like my time, you may have what I have left.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Chambers, you have two minutes, ten seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Thank you, Mr. President. Our rules do provide opportunities out of quandaries such as these, and I will invoke the rule that allows me to request and receive a division of the question. Then Senator Schimek can get what she is entitled to have; then the body can vote specifically on whether they're going to help bring down Senator Schimek's bill by isolating out that piece of
