amendment, because there won't be anything specifically referring to that. It will show up somewhere else, possibly next year in the budget, and it will probably be somewhere around \$25,000-\$30,000. It won't be, probably, the \$51,000 that it cost to implement it. But that's the lay of the land, as I see it. If it's a matter of whether or not we're getting a return on our investment, obviously we're seeing additional funding coming into the state from what it cost to actually implement this, so you could say that there is. But it then comes back to the underlying policy question that Senator Chambers would ask you, whether we should give them any money through this form or not. And I think you can argue on both sides that it's a legitimate position to have if you're opposed to it. But I think the facts will show that there is a benefit to the State Fair as this voluntary program is being produced. So I'm kind of open, to be honest with you, Senator Cudaback. I appreciate the situation that you're in, and I understand the strong opposition that Senator Chambers has, and I understand the desire of Senator Schimek to try to clarify a law that currently isn't a problem, but could be a problem in the future as we begin to look at leases at the State Fairgrounds. This is a prospective change in law. There's no current problem addressed. And the language that came before the Ag Committee was designed to try to prevent future problems, and I think that's appropriate. A lot of times, we're reactive instead of proactive.

SENATOR BAKER: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: So I think LB 1038 is an appropriate proposal. But the idea that it has to happen probably isn't as imminent as some would like to believe. I think it would be a good idea. So again, Senator Cudaback, I appreciate the problem that you're in here. I understand the opposition of the senior member to your proposal. I'd appreciate hearing more from you. I see you've pressed your light during my speech, and I don't know whether I've provoked you to say something or whether you have some additional wisdom you'd like to share, but I'd like to hear from you, because I think this is important for you to have your opportunity to share. Again, the Ag Committee met, seven of us were there, we had the discussion. Granted that you're all
