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entitled to an opinion on how this should play out. But I wanted to at least share a little bit of the background on what actually is being collected for this program compared to other programs, as well as what the potential cost may be, should this not be advanced. And of course, there's the underlying policy decision of whether we should have done this in the first place. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, the State Fair...and I want Senator Cudaback to hear this. The State Fair gets \$2 million a year. You all are the ones who talk about being collegial, and I wind up being more collegial than all of you. I was collegial with Senator Connealy on a bill of his just the other day. So we're not just talking about underlying policies, public policies. We're talking about collegiality. And we do have a few days left in this session, and I'm going to mark well what Senator Kremer does and what Senator Cudaback does, and Senator Connealy, because I've worked with them before. I've worked with Senator Kremer on a bill. Then here they come. One of my colleagues from what they used to refer to in the old days as the distaff side, and suddenly things change. I worked with Senator Burling. So if Senator Schimek's bill goes down--and I will take it down--I'm going to remember my co-conspirators, and I will have justice. The State Fair does not need this pittance that it gets from this checkoff. It's getting \$2 million guaranteed forever. That's written into the constitution, Senator Cudaback. Your old-time car bill was not written into the constitution. Senator Cudaback was very nervous while his bill was pending. He wondered what I would do, and I gave him assurances. I did not even offer every amendment that I could have offered, because I wanted to give him some peace of mind. I wanted him to return to a state of serenity. And now, look what it produces. I've heard of sowing the wind and reaping the whirlwind, but I'm being shown a lesson in one who receives kindness extending the opposite to somebody else. And you all know that once I become...and you have to remember who I told you Atropos is. When I assume the mantle of Atropos, that means the scissors are poised, the blades are open, the thread is between them, and all I have to do is bring those blades
