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issue of hybrid cars, how we're going to have them contribute toward the maintenance and building of roads, so a lot of issues out there. I understand them. The solution is we're going to have to put more money, have to make a commitment. Nebraska is one of the few states in the nation who does not contribute General Fund money to roads. It's user funded. It's through fuel tax, motor vehicle registration fees, and so on. We tax those who use them. That's...I think that's fair. But if we're going to build these expressways--and I understand; I wish we could get them all completed. The South Sioux City/Norfolk--that needs to be done. Perhaps the discussion and working with Department of Roads will focus some more attention on that, but it needs to be done. Those are high traffic volume roads up there, and they need to be upgraded. I'd like to see the proposal by Senator Johnson done, obviously. It goes through my district. I think it would be great. But the bottom line is, we have to increase funding if we're going to do these things. It would contribute to the economic stability and expansion of the ability of companies to site their plants out in these more rural areas, if we had the roads. So that's my challenge to the senators who are coming back. You have to look at increasing funding. We just...we've not been able to do it. We've been through some very tough times where people looked at the Highway Trust Fund and hence this bill to try and tide us over through some difficult financial times, but we're going to have to face reality now and actually contribute some more funds to roads. Whether you're going to change policy, direct General Funds there, or increase the fuel tax and so on, one of those two options is going to have to be looked at and probably implemented real soon, in order to get these projects going. I...the needs are there. We've taken the politics out of roads. They have to go through the set criteria of the Department of Roads, vehicle miles, or average daily vehicles and so on. It works well. I don't suggest we change that. I suggest we look at broadening the scope or increase the size of the pie. With that, I would return the rest of my time to the Chair. Mr. President, thank you.
