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SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you want to build roads for private industry; is that it?

SENATOR JOHNSON: I will build them for whoever will go on them. One of the criticisms I've had in this is that "the wealthy people would go across Nebraska using this road." You know, I kind of like wealthy people to come across Nebraska, because they're the ones that have the money to spend it and help our economy.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What would a wealthy person spend money on in Nebraska?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, Nebraska's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Other than Ted Turner?

SENATOR JOHNSON: (Laugh) Well,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they're mad at him.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...I'd be happy if they came in and each had a big steak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me ask you a question.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you were from another state, a sophisticated state, which would be any state north, south, east, or west of Nebraska, and you were looking at the person who was going to represent that state in Congress,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and this person is standing there with a goofy grin and says, my momma said I got to put my stocking cap on my head or I'll catch a cold...we believe in the Bible in one hand and Nebraska values, got a pitchfork in the other one, and vote for me, then he's walking down a country road in bib overalls and a hayseed sticking out of his head, waving--now you
