guess I used this as an education process. If you want to improve roads, if you want to increase the road building, it's going to take more money. As it is, I think we're falling behind on our road construction program, in addition to the maintenance we have to do. In other words, our backlog is building, much as it was in our building program with our 309 money. We are falling behind, and in today's environment with the cost of things, road costs are going up. So there is a way to do what you want to do--it just costs money. With that, I request to withdraw that amendment, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: FA645 is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, anything else on the committee amendments?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.
