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SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator Langemeier, let me go back to you. Well, let me just ask you one question, because we're only going to have time for one short response here. What is it that you don't like about the storm water bill? Why did you pick that particular section to strike and no other section?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Langemeier.

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Storm water to me is an issue for metropolitan cities that I believe that long term,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, I'm sorry, but your time is up.

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I'll address it on the rest of mine.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, you're recognized, followed by Senator Redfield.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'll be brief. Senator Langemeier, I'm going to oppose your amendment, because I think it destroys the balance we're trying to seek here. With that, Senator Beutler, you can have the rest of my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And I would sublet some of your time to Senator Langemeier, if that's all right, to let him finish his response.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, is that permissible?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Langemeier.

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Thank you, Senator Beutler and Senator Schrock, for the time. As we look at storm water in
