SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to not support or oppose Senator Langemeier's. I think we need to move ahead. It seems like we've been working on this now for three or four, five years, maybe longer, the way time goes, and maybe \$5 million, maybe \$2.5 million, but I think we're going to need some support out there for these entities that are obligated to do this. I suppose you could look at it a little bit that this will offset those nonprofits that are going to have to...that essentially are not going to be paying. I guess that's one way to look at it, if you want to, and maybe you don't want to look at it that way. But that may be one of the considerations in lieu of the fee things that was looked at before.
