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Services, that has...that certainly has some homeland security objectives there; the Department of Agriculture has homeland security objectives there; various departments around state government are kicking in so it becomes a combination of the departments. And if we codify this, then there's a whole new department and the whole Office of Homeland Security. And I think it becomes a license to spend more money, when pooled resources prior were better. So I hope that we can move forward I think with some efficiency and without establishing this new office. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute. Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Chambers. Is Senator Chambers on the floor? He's on his way. You may use that one.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm trying to find out where the body is going to go with this bill, so even though I haven't said much, I still have an interest. And I think Senator Smith intends to do something, but I don't know exactly what. So if I may put a question to him, and he could speak from Senator Schimek's mike, we might can find something out here.

SENATOR CUDABACK: May do so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Smith, are you thinking about doing what you had mentioned to me earlier?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, and I was just in the process of wanting to tell Senator Schimek what my plans were.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then at this point I'm not going to say any more. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Pederson, Don that is.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you, Mr. President. I see that Senator Smith and Senator Schimek are discussing some issues. I simply wanted to say that I think that it's appropriate for us to consider codifying what we do. It's certainly true that what
