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several occasions...and I've always remembered this and I've said it to myself; Speaker Brashear says it really loudly, so it's like burned into my head, we have to differentiate between the people that we're mad at and the people who we're afraid of. Third and fourth offense DUI, I don't know about you, but I'm afraid when my wife is out there in a van with four kids, that they could be the next on that lottery list. That concerns me. These are the people we're afraid of, and quite frankly, there aren't that many of them. But we're dealing with it, I think, in an appropriate manner with this legislation. The Judiciary Committee does have committee amendments to tweak some of the stuff that we've been trying to do in relationship to community corrections, and they also, quite honestly, peeled back from the original bill that we introduced--that I introduced on behalf of the Attorney General--we peeled back almost all of the first offense stuff, and peeled back some of the second offense stuff. This is not draconian legislation. The committee amendment will prove that out. I believe Senator Bourne can speak to some of that, also to the committee amendment. And I believe we're going to have an amendment, hopefully, an amendment to the committee amendment, and I believe there's some other stuff to deal...some other business to deal with in regard to the bill, as well. With that, Mr. President, I would be happy to answer any questions in regard to this legislation, and I want to thank everybody involved for including themselves in this discussion in the past, giving their time, giving their experience. With that, Mr. President, thank you. I'd be happy to answer any questions. That will wrap it up.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend. There are committee amendments, as stated by the Clerk. Chairman Bourne, you're recognized to open on AM2604.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I like to think that in the Judiciary Committee we evaluate these proposals and try to obtain balance between solving the problem, in this case, repeat DUIs, and not punishing more than is necessary to solve the problem. And Senator Friend and I and various members of the committee had extensive discussions on this bill, and we looked at what other states are doing, and the Judiciary Committee amendment reflects our philosophy in the
