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Legislature. Senator Hudkins did approach me about this amendment, and I clearly saw...she had showed me the statement of intent, also the committee statement, and then I read the bill, and realized that they're trying to approach, with legislation like this, some harmony in our statutes. And I would have no problem at all with that. I know Chairman Bourne might have a word to say about that, but at the same time, I think the amendment is appropriate. That's all I'd have, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend. On with discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I just have a couple of questions for clarification I'd like to ask Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hudkins, I know you were saying that this makes the law consistent with another statute. So what will the time requirement be, with the adoption of this amendment?

SENATOR HUDKINS: There is no time requirement.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And when you said that the points are adjusted or made to harmonize...

SENATOR HUDKINS: In one part of the law, currently it says four points; in another part, it says eight points; so we just took a happy medium and now it's six.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I just wasn't sure, because I saw some changes, but I was trying to digest them as you spoke. But it's clear to me now. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you...you are through, Senator? Thank you. Senator Kruse.
