SENATOR BEUTLER: No, that's all of those that are subject to the provision.

SENATOR SMITH: That would likely to...

SENATOR BEUTLER: They would benefit from an increase in the minimum wage.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, what would be the gross costs, then, to the employers for that? I mean, do we just multiply that out, based on a...are those full-time employees, or are those part-time?

SENATOR BEUTLER: They would be both.

SENATOR SMITH: So is it 16,000 FTEs?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sixteen thousand, yes.

SENATOR SMITH: And so if we did the math on that--I haven't done that yet--but 16,000 people, and by October 1 of this year...or as, starting October 1 this year, there would be the difference between \$5.59 and \$5.15 per hour, multiplied by 40 hours a week, 52 weeks a year, save some vacation maybe--maybe it's paid vacation--and then multiply that out over 16,000 people. Is that...?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, I suppose. Depending upon what number you're trying to come up with, that would get you to the overall dollar figure of impact, I suppose.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, because I'm trying to...like when I pulled up the fiscal note, it didn't mention...I think it only mentioned like the cost to Game and Parks.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I don't know where they got that. I don't think there's a cost to Game and Parks, because governmental units are also exempted.

SENATOR SMITH: So the government is exempted from this?
