(Laughter) But that...he can do anything at 67 years old. A young person could probably do a better job in assembling and running mechanical equipment, but they can't touch it. We pay those young people minimum wage and we're very...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...lucky to have them. Yes, I think the minimum wage should be raised, but I just want you...to let you know, from a small business standpoint, what we're going to be up against. We are trying to compete in a market that is very, very competitive. We do not get any grants or LB 620 money to build a new warehouse or expand our grocery store, but we did help one in the North Platte area, and you all know who that was. That company is ruining small businesses throughout this state and the country. Maybe we should check with them on the minimum wage and see what they're paying. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion. Senator Redfield, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Beutler has made much of the fact that this wage has not been adjusted for, I believe you said, 9 years. And I want to remind you that for 13 years the state of Nebraska didn't bother to adjust the brackets on our income tax rates and so we actually reduced the spending power of our citizens, especially those who didn't have much to work with. People get busy. People fight a lot of other issues. They are trying to compete with a global economy, products that are coming in from India, workers in China, and so there are a lot of other things that are on the backs of our businesses. So I don't want this to be a business-bashing bill. I don't think that's what Senator Beutler intends. And I hope that we don't stand here and talk about our businesses trying to take advantage of people, because then we would have to point the finger at ourselves and say, why didn't government adjust the brackets on the income taxes for 13 years? Now Senator Beutler said something else, and I'm going to give him a little time when I'm through, because I thought I heard him say that
