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ought to stop this hypocritical praying. I'm trying to bring you all into reality so that I can't condemn you as much. You think Senator Cunningham would work for minimum wage? No. As a result of carrying water for businesses, he got a job with the grocers organization. You all don't talk about that, do you? But I see the reality of these people who can say, let those poor people not make anything, but in the meantime I'm going to parlay my political position into a job where I can make more money, and don't criticize me. He wouldn't work for minimum wage; nobody in here would, other than me. But just because I am restricted to making minimum wage because of my choices, that doesn't mean I want everybody to be stuck there without any hope of improvement. But that's what they want here. I can't wait for some of these other bills to come up, where you're going to be whining about losing your land. I think the cities ought to take your land and let you get in a position so you understand something. That wasn't my attitude when I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...first came here today, but, by God, by the devil, by the witches, by any and every thing that people invoke when they're trying to make a point, I think until you all are reduced to certain levels, you're not going to understand anything because you don't care. But you want to pray every morning, don't you? Hypocrites. Jesus talked about the poor being sold for a pair of shoes. Well, actually, it's in the Old Testament, but the Old Testament is considered the Word. And the New Testament says, in the beginning was the Word, the Word was with God, the Word was God, the same was in the beginning with God, and the Word was Jesus. So whatever is in the Old Testament or the Jewish Bible, according to what you "Christians" believe, that was Jesus saying it. Jesus said the poor are sold for a pair of shoes. What does that mean to you all? Nothing. You're in a position where you are made stewards and you're given the power to carry out the wishes and will of your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
