Boils down to fast foods. These are the people that will be working the minimum-wage jobs--people with no job skills, no experience, no resources, undependable cars, hopefully on a bus line. But these really are the people that will be out there doing this work for very little money. And it amazes me how people who are comfortable can stand up and say, I don't understand, I don't understand. This is the reality. Senator Beutler is absolutely correct. Senator Aguilar, certainly, absolutely correct. And he is additionally, I would say, correct in referring to seasonal And it makes me so discouraged to hear we will take advantage of people if we can. It's a sad, sad truth. you, and I will return the balance of my time.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Howard. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, when that eminent domain bill comes up, I'm going to remind these people what they're doing here. You love business so much that these working people who sell their bodies, in a sense, by giving their labor, are not worthy of a minimal minimum wage increase. So what are you going to say? They want to take my land for business. Well, you love business; they should get your land. Then you get a minimum-wage job. I'm going to see how you take it. Don't be talking about how you're treated unfairly. You've got land. You can hire lawyers and you can fight for yourself. Why should this Legislature come to your aid? If we're not going to help the least who need our help the most, why should we help you? Because you come from a different milieu, and you want people who are like you to understand your plight and help you against business. Well, if business is so good and you're so worried about them being hurt if we give a pittance of an increase in the minimum wage, won't business be hurt even more if they're not allowed to get your land, if they need it to expand and open new businesses and create new minimum-wage jobs?
