the financial aspect of this concern. I've talked to Senator...to our Speaker Brashear and shared these concerns with him, and in fact did have an amendment ready to submit. And I'm going to just give you the highlights of this: that any mechanism for funding this program or any mechanism that would be made available for, let's say, decision making on this program and have availability to funds--and keep in mind these are public dollars -- would be subject to an annual audit by the Auditor of Public Accounts, and the costs of such audit shall be paid by the endowment provider. A copy of such audit shall be filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts and made available to any member of the Legislature upon request. In addition, this amendment states, no funds in the Early Childhood Education Cash Fund shall be used to pay the administrative costs of the Early Childhood Education Endowment Board of Trustees created in Section 6 of this act, or any endowment provider selected pursuant to Section 4 of this act. And I have discussed this with our Speaker Brashear. He has assured me that he would work with me to address these concerns. And I'd like to offer him the remainder of my time, if he would like to respond to this, (laugh) which he now tells me, thank you, but no. Thank you. I return the balance of my time.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you. Senator Engel, you're recognized.
