SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I empathize with what Senator Redfield is saying. I think that is something that is a legitimate question and one that has no real answer at this point in time. I would like to mention just a couple of things, and I don't want to use all my time to respond to everything that I was asked earlier, but a note in from the lobby reminded me that any time anyone works for someone who withholds, they do pay income tax, and many of these people of course do work for...in those kind of circumstances. I don't think this would encourage more illegal immigration. We're talking probably a very finite number of students who would actually benefit under this program. In fact, one of the things I don't think I shared with you is Jerry Deichert from the University of Omaha did come to the hearing of the Education Committee and did give testimony in a neutral capacity, and his best estimate is that 130 kids would be about the most who would be possible beneficiaries of this bill the first year. So, you know, I think there's a lot more on people's minds than that. As to the question, why don't they just become citizens, I think Senator Aguilar outlined that very, very well. I do want to go back for just a minute and talk about the second packet that you were handed, and I want to call attention to the groups that are supporting this. And the first letter in the packet is powerful. It's by the P-16 Initiative. It's signed by Doug Christensen, the Commissioner of Education; Stan Carpenter, chancellor, Nebraska State College System; Dennis Baack, executive director, Nebraska Community College Association; Jim Griess, executive director, Nebraska State Education Association; John Boniauto, executive director, Nebraska Association of School Boards; Jerry Sellentin, executive director, Nebraska Council of School Administrators; and James B. Milliken, president, University of Nebraska. That's pretty powerful. The second one in your packet is signed by the Gallup Organization. The next one in your packet comes from the Appleseed Center; the next one from the Nebraska Catholic Conference. Some of these you may have already gotten through the mail or e-mail. I mentioned the School Administrators; the Latino Peace Officers Association, Omaha Chapter; the Catholic Charities of Omaha; the Chicano Awareness Center, we got many letters from them. We just included one as a sample. And then
