SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...she was born in Mexico, and I'm going to take an opportunity to read this whole letter at a later time. I'm going to give the rest of my time right now to Senator Ray Aguilar, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, DiAnna Schimek. I just want to real quickly point out something that's very important here. First, I'm going to cover one more tax issue, and that's Social Security taxes. All these workers pay Social Security taxes. The difference between you and them, me and them, is they'll never collect a dime of that. They will never collect a dime of those Social Security taxes. Those go into our system, if you will. And the other thing that I think is the most important point I can make, we have to pass this, this year, folks. It has to happen. Senator Schimek has spent a myriad of time convincing senators to support this, and done an excellent job of it. We can't start all over with 21 new senators next year. It won't happen. We have to do it this year. Please support this issue. Thank you.
