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SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. You know, Senator Jensen stole a little of my thunder also. You know, we are a land of immigrants. We are all here because our ancestors, some of us not too far back, came to this country of opportunity. And, yes, you know, Senator Smith, you wouldn't have a congressional seat to run for if it wasn't for the immigrants because it would have happened. Those of you who were here when we were looking at the population in this state and what would have happened to it if it wasn't for the immigrants. The little town I come from doubled in population. It doubled in population over the last ten years. And we're not asking...we're not advocating that these young people go for nothing. All we're asking for is that they pay the in-state tuition. A lot of them...and Senator Jensen also said the fact that you have maybe two members of the family who were born south of the border; two or three that were born here. Now is that fair? Is that fair? They're still going to have to pay tuition. They'll pay the same tuition that my grandchildren are going to pay, and what my children paid. It's in-state tuition. There's nothing wrong with that, not a thing. And if we educate those young people, I'll tell you what, I'll bet 90-some percent of them will stay in this state. If we don't educate them, we make it almost impossible. It's hard enough to pay the in-state tuition. I look at what the tuition has went up over the last, well, let's see, I'd say 25-30 years, when my kids went to the university. Oh, you know, we thought it was high then but, my gosh, look at it now. Look at what it is now. And I don't know how they're going to pay for it, but they do somehow or other pay for that tuition. So it's not a free ride, not at all. They're still going to have to pay the tuition. When my grandparents came here from Denmark, Senator Jensen's came from Denmark, Senator Johnson's ancestors came from Sweden, Senator Stuthman's probably came from Germany, it was tough. At that time, if you had an 8th grade education, that was sufficient. Then pretty soon you needed a high school education to get along in this world. Now you need a college education, and I see nothing wrong with those young people paying in-state tuition. And, Senator Schimek, I will support your bill. Thank you.
