consumer protection. And Senator Beutler's amendment is the one we're now on, AM2934.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you like to refresh our minds?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, my amendment was a very modest addition which doesn't seem to be at issue now that we're talking about the entire framework. But it merely adds one additional piece of information that should be supplied by an applicant for a license, and that is essentially his past history in working in this area and whether there were any problems of one type or another. That oversimplifies it, but that's the basic idea. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. We'll go back to discussion of AM2934. Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Since we've discussed this bill it's been several hours and I've had a little bit opportunity to research some of the concerns that I had with our local parish in installing an elevator and utilizing elevator expertise and servicing that. And I want to engage in a little discussion with Senator Synowiecki, if I may, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Synowiecki.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Senator Synowiecki, this provision where the service personnel for an elevator and an installed elevator, what does that mean? Does that mean every aspect of the elevator, or just certain components of the elevator?

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: No, the bill relates to installation of an elevator and not the removal of an elevator.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Does it, in the servicing and the repair of the elevator of malfunctions, that has to be a licensed service person from the company?
