SPEAKER BRASHEAR PRESIDING

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Members, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do now sign the following legislative resolutions: LR 317, LR 326, and LR 335. In addition, I propose to sign and do now sign the following legislative bills: LB 968E, LB 968AE, LB 75, LB 188, LB 287E, LB 562, LB 876E, LB 915, LB 1069, and LB 1069A. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: We now go to the next agenda item, Final Reading, E & R Final, motions to return to Select File for a specific amendment. Mr. Clerk, LB 994.

CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to LB 994, the first motion I have, Senator Jensen, I have AM2926 but a note you want to withdraw that amendment, Senator?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Jensen would move to return for a specific amendment, AM2984. (Legislative Journal page 1375.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, you're recognized to open on your motion to return.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. If you'll recall when LB 994 was up for debate, late one evening and we got into a situation between physical therapists and chiropractors and rather somewhat of an emotional debate. And that's why I pulled the amendment that was before us at that time. And after that, Senator Smith, and I publicly want to thank him for bringing forward an amendment that certainly had some language that would bring the physical therapists and the chiropractors back into agreement. And so I would just ask that LB 994 be returned so that we can bring forth that language in this bill. Thank you, Mr. President.
