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They're tired. They shake a baby. And actually, a baby does quit crying when you shake it because of the trauma caused inside their brain. This, I think, is a little bit of money with a very good tested program that could prevent child abuse in Nebraska, prevent tragedies for babies, for their families, take away from the court system the prosecution of these cases. There's just tremendous research behind this. I kind of, quite frankly, came into it kind of not exactly skeptical, but wondering how much could actually happen from this type of information. And it is significant. And so with that, I would yield a little bit of time to Senator Jensen and would appreciate your support of this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Jensen, about 5 minutes.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Certainly, it was a very compelling hearing when the bill came forward certainly Senator Thompson's introduction. You know, parents and raising children and, without a doubt, without any education, and we don't educate individuals on how to raise families, and there are times when, yes, you've had a very, very hard day and you're stressed and the baby is crying, won't stop. And so you think that you can grab ahold of that youngster and get him to stop. And all this is, is really educating individuals that maybe, we talk about time out for kids, you sometimes need time out for parents just to gather their thoughts and say what is right. So I certainly endorse this. It's a minimal cost but I think it can have some tremendous results. Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you, Senator Thompson.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen and Senator Thompson. You heard the motion to return for specific amendments. Senator Stuhr, on the motion, followed by Senator Erdman.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I do support the amendment to return and do support the concept. I go back a little bit further than Senator Thompson, remembering that Senator Hilgert introduced this issue before the Education Committee a number of years ago. And I'm just
