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FLOOR DEBATE

April 3, 2006 LB 808

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on AM2931, offered by Senator Kopplin. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I rise just to say that I concur with Senator Kopplin's conclusion. I ask for the adoption of the amendment as well.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Further discussion? Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Me too. Thank you. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Any further discussion? Those two were pretty quickly done. Seeing no further discussion, Senator Kopplin, you're recognized to close. Senator Kopplin waives closing. The question before the body is, shall AM2931 be adopted to LB 808? All in favor vote aye; opposed, nay. We're voting on adoption of the Kopplin amendment to LB 808. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kopplin's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Kopplin amendment has been adopted. Next amendment.

CLERK: Senator Raikes would move to amend with AM3003. (Legislative Journal page 1381.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, to open on AM3003.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. This amendment is two parts. I'll explain to you the first one, and then Senator Landis can explain the second part. The first part offers clarifying language...or, a clarifying change regarding county zoning authority on buildings located on farmsteads that are used as residences. Currently, state law requires counties to determine whether nonfarm buildings used as residences shall be subject to zoning regulations. However, the definition of
