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each other?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If, perchance, all of the crime families had a summit meeting and they came out of that meeting in total agreement, nobody was shot, no contracts on anybody, would that raise a red flag perhaps in the minds of law enforcement persons?

SENATOR JENSEN: Ah...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm talking about crime families.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right.

SENATOR JENSEN: Not having a great deal of experience with crime families, but it may. It may raise that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. You're...we're both speculating.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you ever heard or read of such an occurrence taking place?

SENATOR JENSEN: Not often.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have not either. Now, sometimes I approach something through indirection. You read off a list of individuals and organizations, operations, agencies, who have come to an agreement on what you're presenting to us today. Is that generally correct?

SENATOR JENSEN: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On occasion, have some of these entities been in conflict with each other on specific issues?
