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talking about. It's about \$10 million a year, and half of that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, practically speaking, we couldn't protect all of it. We couldn't keep the Legislature out of the mix altogether. And it seems to me that, based on what the purpose of this money is, no more than 10 percent should be available to be siphoned off and used for something that might be actually contrary to the specific purposes that the money in this fund is for.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And you're considering that the 10 percent of the 44.5, right?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Just the Environmental Trust side of it,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...in this case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I mean, realizing there's going to be discussion on the educational funds side, too.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But if that's \$5 million, we can take, say, a half a million dollars out if we wanted to. A hundred million is out of range, you understand that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I know that. I was saying I used round numbers so it was easy for me. I started to say \$1, but that would make me seem like a piker. So it's as easy to say \$100 million as 100 cents.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Now, is this in lieu of Senator Beutler's amendment that he withdrew? I guess...can I ask Senator Beutler a question, Mr. Speaker?
