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I have gone to great pains to present very detailed handouts that I gave to all members of this Legislature, and some represent areas of the city where nonwhite children go to school, but none of them stood up and talked about our children. That is just a red herring. It's a smoke screen. They have a different agenda and, whatever it is, they ought to just say it forthrightly. This amendment that I'm talking about takes no money from education. It does not alter the formula for distributing these funds. I was the strongest opponent of the State Fair amendment, and you all are the ones who voted to put it into the constitution. I tried to stop you. I did everything I could to stop you, and you all put it in the constitution. So what I have said and am saying with this amendment, since you have done this thing, you ought to deliver on the promise that you made. There was discussion, even on the State Fair proposal, about money continuing to go to the Environmental Trust Fund, and I was warning people at that time that without some protection put into the constitution for those entities, in the same way that the State Fair Board's money was protected, they could be raided by the Legislature. And that is what happened. You all don't pay attention to me until you get in trouble. And you wouldn't get in trouble if you'd listen. But you cannot think about two things at the same time. I try to give you little images that you can put in your mind so you can hold two things at the same time. Think about it as a coin. You're able to think of a coin. You're able to think of heads and tails, two sides of the same coin. You can hold two things in your mind if I reduce it to that level. So when I tried to show you--and you can look at the transcript--that you were not constructing constitutional language that protected the Environmental Trust, or even education, you didn't care. Senator Bourne didn't join me...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...in objecting, not that I recall. We can look at how they voted. So what is being attempted by this amendment is not to take money from any other entity, not to alter the formula for the distribution of these funds, but merely to ensure that since you put into the constitution that money would go to this Environmental Trust, that that is not
