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SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Mines, thank you very much. On the question of priorities, there was one more thing I wanted to explore with you, Senator Jensen, if I...if I could. To a certain extent here in Nebraska, one might...one might say we have a little more leeway with respect to cutting back on the program in the sense that at least a few years ago we were providing a lot of optional services in Medicaid, a lot more than other states were, many other states at least. Can you just give us a brief description of where we stand now with optional services, that is, services that the federal government does not require that we provide but that we choose to provide...

SENATOR JENSEN: You want...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...for one reason or another? I may be catching you off guard here. I'm sorry. But if...if you can describe that...

SENATOR JENSEN: Would you like me to list them?

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to some extent.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Jensen, would you respond, please?

SENATOR JENSEN: Would you like me to list them?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, that would be of interest to me,...

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...if you could do it quickly.

SENATOR JENSEN: We have 17. To many states, that's more than what they have. We have prescription drugs. That's probably the most expensive one. That's an optional service. It's not mandated. Home- and community-based services for persons with mental...either mental problems or DD; intermediate care facilities for persons with mental retardation. That's the ICF-MR. We have HCBS for older adults and persons with disabilities; dental services; rehabilitation services; case
