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really looking at that issue. We do have a preferred drug list, but I think we can do more in that regard. I think there are drug companies that will help us with this by directing individuals to get drugs at a lower cost, to get drugs from some pharmacy groups. One of the issues we hadn't talked about in Nebraska, we need to do more to our federally qualified health clinics, excellent way to provide healthcare for individuals and they do it at a very reasonable cost. We have Charles Drew, we have OneWorld in Omaha, we have one in Columbus and Scottsbluff and Lincoln. We need to expand those. There needs to be one in Grand Island. There should be one up at Norfolk. Those are areas...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...that will provide services at low cost. They don't turn anybody away. They don't ask if they're an immigrant or if they're a citizen. Excellent, excellent facilities and we need to expand that. That's part of this program, too. I would just ask that we move along. I'd be glad to sit down with anyone between now and Select File to see if we can improve this. If there is intent language, Senator Synowiecki, that you would like to have in this directing that and being more specific on that private partnership and improving insurance, I'd be glad to do that. If we can just move forward with some of this and certainly address Senator Chambers' questions and Senator Beutler's questions any way that we can, but those are priorities that I want to go to or priorities in what will save the system for those who are going to come later and need those services. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Howard, followed by Senators Kruse and Schimek.

SENATOR HOWARD: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the body. I, too, am very concerned about this issue and, as a member of the Health and Human Services Committee, had enough concerns that I voted against passing this bill to the floor. Over the years I worked at Health and Human Services, I saw many abuses of the medical system, primarily people going to the
