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action, and then the learning community shall be considered one school district for purposes of remedial court action, to achieve integrative requirements.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, and it could be allocation of resources. I'm going to ask you another question...

SENATOR BOURNE: It could be.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...because of the issue you raised from your testimony in committee, about the allocation of resources. And my information, if it's accurate, says that Omaha right now gets more...spends more per pupil than any of the districts in the surrounding area. Would that be accurate, including federal funds?

SENATOR BOURNE: You know what? I've seen Senator Pahls' information that he has kindly handed out each day, and you know, frankly, his information indicates that, and it's probably true. I don't know, and frankly, I don't care, because that's not...that doesn't have anything to do with the integration that I'm talking about. I think it's probably a better question for Senator Raikes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BOURNE: My understanding is, it's in a vacuum; that you're not comparing apples to oranges, but I think Senator Raikes would probably have a better answer.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you, Senator. I would ask Senator Raikes. I have other questions, Senator Bourne, but I'll try to stay on point.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, may I have Senator Raikes' comments on that? The per pupil costs, Senator Raikes, as they vary between Omaha schools and the amount of money spent on administration, versus the amount of money spent on teaching?
