SENATOR CUDABACK: So ordered. It is withdrawn.

SENATOR HOWARD: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kopplin, to open on AM3038 to the committee amendments. Is Senator Kopplin present? Senator Kopplin. Senator Kopplin, your amendment is up. Senator Kopplin, you're recognized to open on your amendment, AM3038, to the Education Committee amendments, AM2687, to LB 1024. Senator Kopplin, on AM3038.

SENATOR KOPPLIN: Mr. President, I'd like to withdraw that amendment and bring it back on Select File.
