bogged down with the red tape, they don't get the chance to teach. You take your good teachers and your good administrators—this isn't necessary. Educators are tired of the paperwork, and I don't think that we as a Legislature should put more and more and more burden onto the professional educators themselves. It's expensive, and it gets us nowhere. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Raikes, there are no further lights on. I will recognize you to close on AM3065.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I appreciate the discussion on this. I think there are several good points that have been brought up. I particularly take into note Senator Bourne's concern with the participation of school districts in a plan to achieve results in the area of integration. I will certainly be willing to...continuing my conversations with him to work on this. In the meantime, I would ask your support of the amendment. Thank you.
