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SENATOR SMITH: Right. So there...the boundary issue hasn't been resolved at the local level, so you're wanting the Legislature to resolve that; is that accurate?

SENATOR CORNETT: The boundary issue was set in an agreement that was reached in 1983. We feel that we need to readdress that issue because of the growth the county has seen and the growth that Bellevue and Papillion have both seen.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, but you're wishing the boundaries to follow the Bellevue...

SENATOR CORNETT: Yes.

SENATOR SMITH: ...boundaries instead of Papillion-LaVista?

SENATOR CORNETT: Our aim is school boundaries would follow annexation for the city...

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CORNETT: ...which they currently do not do. As we annex based on that agreement, the school district would remain in the other city, even though that's the city of Bellevue.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, thank you, Senator Cornett. And thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Kopplin on the Cornett amendment.

SENATOR KOPPLIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Oh, my goodness! Here we go, my friend Senator Cornett. The area of land that Senator Cornett has described is in my district, and I can tell you from the e-mails that I have received, those people have no desire to be a part of the Bellevue Public Schools. But that is not the issue. In the early eighties, the two school districts made an agreement--one says I will take this, and you can have that. It was a signed agreement, written agreement. Everybody agreed. Now Bellevue
