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fight, and we can solve the Aquila/MUD fight with the type of legislation...with the type of statutes that are already in the books and the type of legislation that is tweaking those statutes. Look, there was a report, Senator Hartnett sponsored it....

SENATOR BAKER: One minute.

SENATOR FRIEND: ... I believe Senator Landis was on this committee at the time, to look into what was going to be the right thing to do in regard to regulatory legislation for the state of Nebraska. There wasn't a whole lot about service territories, but what there was, was an idea that we would create or establish a governing body in regard to natural gas. Well, I think we have that. I brought this up last year and I created some confusion with the PSC. We have that. They know how to deal with these issues now, because they've had legislation since 1999 on the books to deal with it. It's just inadequate. It's flawed. But we can fix it; we can fix it, and I daresay, I think AM2708 does that. I'd like some feedback on what the bill...on what we're trying to accomplish, other than from Senator Landis, because Senator Landis does believe that it's going to take more than just this tweaking to accomplish this. He's seen more than I have

SENATOR BAKER: Time.

SENATOR FRIEND: ...but I'm telling you, the PSC can deal with this issue, and they...

SENATOR BAKER: Time.

SENATOR FRIEND: ...can deal with it with AM2708.

SENATOR BAKER: Time.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Friend. Senator Redfield, followed by Senators Bourne, Thompson, and Dwite Pedersen.
