But I am looking at this note that Senator Cornett handed out regarding a judge ordering Aquila to tear down a plant, which is \$140 million. A Cass County, Missouri, judge is giving Aquila until May 31 to begin tearing down a \$140 million power plant that went up last summer without county approval.
