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to yield some time to Senator Pederson, but in his absence, I would say that there's about \$78,000 impact, and then there's a \$2 million loss of revenue. So...and Senator Hudkins is correct, this was defeated on General File. But Senator Pederson, in the interest of time, I'll let you explain the fiscal impact.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you very much,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...Senator Schrock, Mr. President. Yes, Senator Beutler alluded to the fact that we don't really know exactly how much this is going to cost, but as of March 6, the Revenue Department came out with the fiscal note, which says it's going to cost \$2 million, and it's going to cost about...a little over \$78,000 to administer this particular program. So these are significant dollars, and to add that at this particular time I think is unnecessary. This was defeated on the first go-around, and I think it should be defeated at this time. I think we need to evaluate total pictures in regard to water, and I don't think this necessarily accomplishes that. I think this is one method by which we could look into it. But I think at this late date in the Legislature in this session, I think we shouldn't be bringing things back up again that have already been defeated, quite frankly. And I don't want to add two more million dollars, plus \$78,000, to the...to our ongoing expenses. So for that reason, I would urge you to reject this proposal. I was going to say something about Rasputin, about...those of you who remember Rasputin, you know, you choked him, you shot him, you tried to poison him, but he still came back. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Schrock, did you wish to have some of your time back? Senator Schrock waives his time. Senator Fischer.

SENATOR FISCHER: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'll make this short. I am opposed to this amendment. I opposed it when it was on General File. It was defeated on General File, for the reasons that some of the previous speakers have
